Verizon FiOS

We are happy to announce that Verizon has completed wiring the entire building for Verizon FiOS service including TV, Internet, and Digital Phone. Recycling News

You may have heard that Mayor Bloomberg announced that starting the end of April 2013, "if it's a rigid plastic - any rigid plastic - recycle it." This is NYC's biggest expansion of its recycling program in 25 years. All hard plastics will be accepted including shampoo bottles, clothes hangers, toys and other household objects. We will continue to have the plastic containers for the paper recycling, and recycle container for your old batteries, CD/DVD's, etc. and clothing donation container located in the Laundry Room. Discarded electronic equipment should be brought to the Basement.

Air Conditioners

Now that the warm weather is here, it's a good time to remind all residents that if you are considering having a through-the-window air-conditioner (A/ C) unit installed or re-installed, the Coop requires that all A/C units must be installed by a licensed and insured professional. Neither shareholders/ residents nor any building staff may install (or remove) A/C units. New York City Local Law 11/98 requires that all A/C units in our building be installed with a safety bar (available from Michael Ryan) that allows them to be in place without resting against the window sash. It's a good idea to remember that we all have the power to control the building's energy costs, please make sure your A/C units are maintained properly, energy star rated, and shut off when you are not at home.

Cool NYC Program

Con Edison, now in its third year with ThinkEco Company, has an energysaving program for Con Edison residential and small business customers in NYC called coolNYC to control your A/C units from anywhere. coolNYC provides its members with a FREE product, ThinkEco's "modlet" smartAC solution, and by wirelessly hooking up your existing window A/C unit to the modlet, you can now control your A/C and temperature from any smartphone, laptop or portable device browser.

Unfortunately they will not send bulks amounts to the buildings as they found that many go unused/wasted if residents are not the ones initiating the interest. If interested, you must visit www.coolnycprogram.com to sign up.
